See draft study recommendations for potential, future transportation improvements on the Route 17/Route 360 Corridor in the Town of Tappahannock and Essex County from Airport Road to LaGrange Industrial Drive.

Route 17 and Route 360 run concurrently from Queen Street through Brays Fork in Tappahannock.

This study is examining safety issues for motorists, pedestrians, and other travel modes like bicyclists and bus riders. It is also examining traffic congestion and access spacing issues.
