Find out about the proposed location and major design features for the Progress Park Connector project in Wythe County. The Progress Park Connector is a proposed 2.3-mile two-lane roadway from the intersection of Nye Road to the intersection of Route 792 (E. Lee Trinkle Drive), providing a direct connection to Progress Park.

The hearing will be held as a virtual/online event. VDOT representatives will make a presentation beginning at 5 p.m. and will be available to answer questions once the presentation is completed.
