

FOURTH OF JULY 2022

VDOT will lift most lane closures for holiday travel for the Fourth of July weekend at noon on Friday, July 1 until noon on Tuesday, July 5. However, motorists may encounter semi-permanent work zones or travel delays in VDOT's Lynchburg District in the following locations:

Amherst County

Route 682 – Realignment of Woody's Lake Road. Road closure and detour in place.

Campbell County

Route 29 (Airport Bridge) – Replacing northbound bridge over Norfolk Southern Railroad. Right shoulder closed through the work zone.

Cumberland County

Route 621 – Replacing bridge over Appomattox River. Road closure and detour in place.

Halifax County

Route 501/Route 610 – Safety improvements with added passing lanes. Route 501 Southbound traffic detoured via Route 610 Murphy Grove Road with one-way traffic pattern along Route 610. Route 501 Northbound one-way traffic pattern in place from southern intersection of Route 501 and Route 610 to northern intersection of Route 501 and Route 610. Speed limit reduced to 35 mph in the work zone at all times.

City of Lynchburg

Route 29 (Jumbo's Bridges) – Replacing northbound and southbound bridges over Norfolk Southern Railroad. Speed limit reduced to 45 mph in northbound work zone.

Nelson County

Route 60 – Rehabilitating bridge over James River. Speed limit reduced to 45 mph. Traffic restricted to one lane with a width restriction of 11-feet. Signals, signs and message boards in place.

Pittsylvania County

Route 29 – Rehabilitating bridge over Banister River. Speed limit reduced to 45 mph. Traffic restricted to one lane northbound and southbound.

Prince Edward County

Route 15/Route 133 Intersection – Roundabout construction. Route 133 road closure with detour in place. Route 15 traffic to be maintained at all times with traffic shifts and lane closures as necessary.
